Insight or reasoning and planning skills - Inappropriate or compulsive - Seizures, headaches, fatigue or other medical conditions <p>I can best communicate in a calm, non-confrontational manner. Brain Injury Survivor Wallet Card

A person with a brain injury can carry this wallet card to help avoid misunderstandings with law enforcement, first responders and others. The card includes contact information, common signs and symptoms of brain injury and a request to call a designated emergency contact if needed.

Instructions:

1. **Download wallet card (PDF) *****
2. Either type in your information on the PDF or print it out and write in your information. Try to use hard stock paper
3. Highlight your typical symptoms on the list provided or write in others not included.
4. Trim card along the edges. Fold in middle so you have a front and back of card. Card may be laminated to make sturdier (office supply co's may offer laminating service for a fee); use clear packing tape to cover it front and back
